"The Iowa Department of Public Health (IDPH) has worked for the past several years to increase rates of breastfeeding initiation and duration because breastfeeding is a key strategy to preventing obesity among children and youth. Five years ago, Iowa ranked 31 out of 53 states and territories on a national survey, the Maternity Practices in Infant Nutrition and Care (mPINC). When we looked a little deeper, we realized that the rural nature of our state made maternal nutrition and care somewhat difficult."
