Global Breastfeeding Scorecard, 2017: Tracking Progress for Breastfeeding Policies and Programmes

According to the Global Breastfeeding Collective, out of 129 countries with available data, only 23 countries are currently meeting the 2030 global goal of at least 60% of infants exclusively breastfeeding at six months. The overall rate of exclusive breastfeeding at 6 months of age is only 40%. WHO and UNICEF stress the urgency for funding, regulation of marketing of breast-milk substitutes,

paid maternity leave, Ten Steps to Successful Breastfeeding, breastfeeding counseling, community support programmes, national assessment of breastfeeding policies and programmes, and national monitoring of breastfeeding rates to increase breastfeeding rates worldwide. "Breastfeeding is one of the most effective investments a country can make to ensure a smarter, healthier population."

Aromatherapy and Breastfeeding

https://naha.org/explorearomatherapy/safety/ According to the National Association for Holistic Aromatherapy (NAHA), factors that can influence the safety of essential oils are the quality of essentials oil being used, the chemical composition of the oil, the method of application, the dosage/dilution that is applied, the integrity of the skin, and the age of the client. While essentials oils could potentially create "irritation or minor discomfort, it is extremely unlikely to create serious injuries or lasting physical problem." The NAHA supports the International Federation of Professional Aromatherapists (IFPA) Pregnancy Guidelines, as well as it outlines that the following essential oils should not be used during pregnancy, labor, or breastfeeding: aniseed, basil ct. estragole, birch, camphor, hyssop, mugwort, parsley seed or leaf, pennyroyal, sage, tansy, tarragon, thuja, wintergreen, and wormwood. "Although many essential oils are potentially hazardous materials, if handled in the appropriate manner, the risks involved in their use can be very small. So therefore, most commercially offered essential oils are safe to use for the purpose intended in a domestic/professional or clinical environment." https://naha.org/assets/upl oads/PregnancyGuidelines-Oct11.pdf

There are five components of cultural competency: cross cultural awareness, cultural knowledge, cultural skill, cultural encounters, and cultural desire. One effective way of cross cultural communication is the LEARN Model. This includes listening, explaining, acknowledging, recommending, and negotiating.
