Donor Human Milk for the High-Risk Infant: Preparation, Safety, and Usage Options in the United States

ions.org/content/pediatrics/ 139/1/e20163440.full.pdf In January, the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) released Pediatrics Volume 139(1) which states that although a mother's own milk is preferred first, the use of pasteurized "donor human milk is increasing for high-risk infants, primarily for infants born weighing <1500g or those who have severe intestinal disorders" when a mother's own milk is insufficient. It is strongly recommended that human milk donors be screened and donated milk should be

pasteurized in accordance with all policies and procedures. Health care professionals should stress the risks of informal milk sharing of unpasteurized milk to families including but not limited to contamination and exposure to medications and drugs. The AAP stresses the importance of availability of donor human milk based on medical necessity, not financial status. Policies are needed ensure that the distribution of donor human milk is not limited by the family's ability to pay.

American Academy of Pediatrics New Safe Sleep Recommendations to Protect Against SIDs.

room/pages/americanacademy-of-pediatricsannounces-new-safe-sleeprecommendations-toprotect-against-sids.aspx "Approximately 3,500 infants die annually in the United States from sleep related deaths, including sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS); illdefined deaths; and accidental suffocation and strangulation". The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) recommends that infants should sleep in the same bedroom, but on a separate, safe surface for at least 6 months of life up to a year. Hazardous surfaces for infants include sofas, couches, and cushioned chairs. Other safe sleeping recommendations are placing baby on his or her back on a firm surface with a tight fitted sheet, avoiding crib bumpers, blankets, and pillows, and avoiding exposure to smoke, alcohol, and illicit drugs. Skin-toskin, breastfeeding, pacifiers at nap and bedtime, tummy time, and vaccinations are encouraged as added protection against SIDS.
